



Patrolling Etiquette

So that we make sure patrols are adequately resourced I ask that we each adopt the following Patrolling etiquette:

- If for any reason you can't make a scheduled patrol or part there of, it is your responsibility to contact your Patrol Captain in advance of the scheduled patrol to advise of your absence.
- You should seek to a replacement as it is better to have fully manned patrols on the beach. This is not a difficult task, simply telephone the patrolling members on the floaters list at the back of the patrol roster, with appropriate notice they are generally more than helpful in acting as a replacement or swap a patrol with a member from another patrol.
- To finalise the arrangement contact your Patrol Captain and advise the name of the replacement that will be filling in for you.

I know first hand that we are all busy people who have many other commitments on weekends that will at some time or another result in us not being able to attend to our patrol commitments, however, if we can all take the time to follow the stated patrolling etiquette it would be greatly appreciated.
